2. Paul stayed in Ephesus three years – Acts 20:31; three months in the synagogue – Acts 19:8; two years in the Hall of Tyrannus – Acts 19:9-10

3. Baptism in the name of Jesus was preached by Peter on the day of Pentecost – Acts 2:38
4. Paul later spoke of Apollos' influence in Corinth – 1 Corinthians 1:12; 3:4-6; 16:12; Titus 3:13
5. John's baptism pointed toward Christian baptism, which is complete – Matthew 11:3; Luke 7:19-22; John 1:19-37; 3:25-42
6. The Samaritans received the miraculous gift of the Holy Spirit through Peter and John – Acts 8:17
7. Those who touched the fringe of Jesus' cloak were healed – Mark 5:27-34; 6:56
8. Healing effects of Peter's shadow – Acts 5:15
